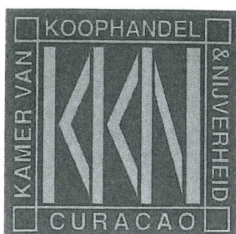

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

The Curaçao Chamber of Commerce & Industry (the "Chamber") is a public-law institution established and governed by the National Ordinance of 6 November 1944 (P.B. 1944 no. 201), as amended, including Article 6, paragraph 5 of the National Ordinance published in A.B. 2010 no. 87 and the amendment published in A.B. 2010 no. 102.

Founded in 1884, the Chamber is the official representative body of the private sector in Curaçao. In that capacity, it promotes and safeguards the interests of private enterprise, facilitates doing business in and through Curaçao, and advises the Government on economic matters affecting the business community.

Pursuant to the above legislation, the Chamber is further charged with statutory duties assigned by law or decree. These duties include, inter alia, the keeping and maintenance of the Commercial Register in accordance with the Trade Register Ordinance (O.G. 2009 no. 51).

Within the scope of its statutory mandate, the Chamber is authorized, inter alia, to issue certified excerpts and other declarations based on the registrations recorded in the Commercial Register, to issue Certificates of Origin for (re-)export, and to legalize authorized signatures.

In this capacity, the Chamber hereby certifies that:

- The company ***Redacted*** incorporated on November 13, 2017, is duly registered in the Commercial Register under number 145353, as of November 14, 2017; and
- On this 17th day of March 2026, the company meets the applicable statutory requirements for registration in the Commercial Register and, on the basis of the information recorded therein, exists as a legal entity under the laws of Curaçao.
